“Verse 4 of Deuteronomy chapter 6 is called ‘The Shema’ from the Hebrew word for ‘hear’. The devout Jew recites it several times a day to affirm his faith in Jehovah. The worship of foreign gods was always a threat to Israel, and this statement of faith reminded the Jews that Jehovah is the true and living God who alone deserves worship and obedience [see 1 John 5:21].

*We must love the Lord with **all** our hearts by keeping **all** His Word **all** the days of our lives [see Dt 6:2. He cannot accept half-hearted worship or obedience [see Eph 6:6 & 1 John 5:3].*

How do we show our love to Him? By hearing and obeying His Word and by sharing it with others. If we love God, His truth will be a part of our normal daily conversation. We also show our love to Him by appreciating His blessings. Times of prosperity become times of temptation if we receive the gifts but fail to thank the Giver [see Dt 6:10-15].

<p style="text-align: center;">The Scriptures in English – A Short History [29]</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Miles Coverdale [1488 -1569]</u></p> <p>When Elizabeth I came to the throne, Miles Coverdale returned to England. In common with many returning 'Mary-exiles', he was anxious for a much more thorough work of reformation than was pleasing to the English establishment. Not content to 'be quiet' as the rector of St Magnus, London, he resigned the living but carried on a ministry while refusing to wear a surplice. His end was apparently happy, and he died at the age of 81 having served the written and the Incarnate Word through four tumultuous reigns. His enduring exhortation, found in his Bible's 'A prologue to the reader', was, 'Go to now (most deare reader) & syt thee downe at the Lordes fete and reade his words.'</p>
